Statement of Faith: We Believe...

1. The Bible is our primary authority (2 Timothy 3:15,16). SCS will be a school that studies, teaches, and seeks to obey the Bible. We will honor the Bible as God's Word and trust it as the final infallible authority on all matters of faith and practice.
2. There is one God, eternally existent in three persons (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) - the Trinity. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matthew 28:19)
3. In the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ. He is to be honored as head of the church (Colossians 1:18). We will seek to follow Jesus in all we do. School leadership will pray about all decisions and seek unity, listening for the voice of Christ.

Philosophy of Education

Sunnyvale Christian School believes a partnership between parents and SCS is crucial for a child's healthy development. We know that positive experiences and solid developmental foundations are key to a child's success. Sunnyvale Christian School guides children from an early age through every phase of learning in social, emotional, spiritual, and cognitive development. We provide a strong curriculum and teach using a number of learning materials and strategies to meet the needs of each student and their learning style. We have high academic standards for students to develop learning skills, comprehension, good study habits, responsibility, and all the foundational skills needed to progress. Along with academic excellence, we also focus on helping each child develop their own creativity, critical thinking, collaboration, 21st Century Skills, and good citizenship. We provide various ways of learning

and expose students to the Arts, their community, STEM, and Computer Science. In addition, we provide enrichment and various activities for their physical and spiritual advancement. We provide a safe structured learning environment for students to receive a top quality Christian education that consistently maintains a competitive edge over the public school system. Students will be equipped to excel whether they proceed to private Christian school environments or the public school.

Expected Student Outcomes

We have the following goals for all students at Sunnyvale Christian School. We expect our graduates to:

1. Be examples of confident, responsible, and community service oriented Christians, with a healthy worldview and desire to shine for Jesus.
2. Manifest the moral and ethical teaching of God's Word in their conduct.
3. Think for themselves, standing up for personal convictions in the face of pressure, while respecting the views of others.
4. Understand that God gives people free will and that choices have consequences. To make good choices means to enjoy positive consequences.
5. Acquire the knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to contribute to society, striving to improve the values of their world.
6. Learn citizenship, exemplified through courtesy, respect, honesty, obedience, self-control, responsibility, involvement, enthusiasm, and acceptance of correction.

Admission Philosophy, Policies, and Procedures

Sunnyvale Christian School is open to anyone interested in securing a Biblical education, from Preschool through Fifth Grade, who agrees (and whose parents agree) that he or she shall abide by Sunnyvale Christian School rules. It must always be understood that attendance at Sunnyvale Christian School is a privilege and not a right. This privilege may be forfeited by any student or parent who does not conform to the school's standards of conduct and/or who is unwilling to adjust to our environment.

All students should want to attend Sunnyvale Christian School and agree to honestly and wholeheartedly apply themselves to "study to show [themselves] approved unto God" (2 Timothy 2:15). Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth.

Sunnyvale Christian School admits students of any race, color, religion, national, and ethnic origins to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, national, and ethnic origin in admissions policies, scholarship programs, and other school-administered programs. Sunnyvale Christian School reserves the right to select students on the basis of academic performance, religious commitment, lifestyle choices, and personal qualifications including a willingness to cooperate with Sunnyvale Christian School administration and to

abide by school policies. Admission is based on a genuine commitment to a Christian education on the part of both students and parents. Priority will be given to returning students and their siblings.

The administration reserves the right to expand the enrollment process to include academic placement testing and an interview process which may include not only the student and parents, but also the school in which the family is transferring from.

Safety

1. Please do not hold gates open for anyone, even if they are familiar to you. It is your responsibility to make sure the gate is closed behind you.
2. Parents must drop off their child in the morning in the parking lot. Parents are not allowed on campus before school.
3. All people must check in at the office before entering the campus. No unauthorized persons are allowed on campus.

Chapel

Chapel will be held on a weekly basis. Chapel is designed for Praise, Worship, sharing, and instruction. Each class will present at least one Chapel presentation during the school year. The school office and campus will be closed during chapel. You must arrive before or after chapel to drop off your child. SCS is closed during chapel from 9:00 AM - 9:50 AM.

Allergies

1. Nut Free Environment

Please provide nutritional lunches and snacks for your child. SCS strives to provide an environment considerate of the many nut allergies many children suffer from. Please avoid sending items that contain nuts or their by-products. Avoid packing candy and empty carbs, which cause anxiety and does not help children focus and learn. No warm-ups can be accommodated. Pack the lunch ready for your child to eat.

2. Pets

SCS strives to provide an environment considerate of the many allergies that many children suffer from including animals. Pets, including dogs, cats or reptiles are not allowed on campus. Service dogs are permitted when the proper certification is turned into the office. The service dog must be on a leash at all times while on campus.

3. Epipens

If your child has severe allergies and in need of an epipen, you must sign a release form in the office giving your authorization.

Tuition

Tuition is paid monthly over 11 months starting in August and ending in June. We spread the payments over the year. Families may choose one of the discounts listed, if they apply:

1. Crosswalk Community Church membership 10% discount
2. Sibling discount (applies across both Preschool and Elementary)
 - a. First child enrolled = full tuition
 - b. Second child enrolled = 15% on lower tuition
 - c. Third child enrolled = 20% on lowest tuition

Tuition is due on the first of each month and is considered late after the fifth of the month. All billing is through FACTS and a late fee of \$25.00 will be automatically applied to all outstanding accounts.

Enrollment Fees

For your convenience, we assume that every family will remain in the SCS program; therefore, we bill the cost of registration for the NEXT academic year on our auto enrollment day at the end of January. Students will automatically be enrolled and charges processed, unless otherwise requested in writing 2 weeks prior to auto enrollment in January.

Financial Aid & Scholarships

Financial aid is available for a limited number of students, on a case by case basis, to be filed online through FACTS yearly. All applications must be complete to be considered and the process is the same for everyone. There is a fee to begin the financial aid process. Our Administration commits to prayerfully consider every application submitted by May 1st for the upcoming Fall semester.

Student Release Authorization

Your child will only be released to those so named on your child's emergency information form or an authorized pick-up form. Verbal permission is not legally sufficient. The names of any adult authorized for pick-up MUST be in writing. A temporary authorization pick-up form is available in the office. If you need to add an additional name to your emergency information form, please see the office staff.

Holidays

SCS will be closed for the following holidays: Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Break, Christmas Break, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, President's Day/Winter Break, Easter Break, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Independence Day, and other designated Teacher "in-service" days. Please mark your calendars using our school year calendar.

Student Withdrawals

The educational program at SCS is based on a progressive scope and sequence designed to holistically develop your child through their early years of child development (Preschool through Fifth Grade). We strongly encourage you to have your child attend our program through Fifth Grade. However, we are aware that families experience unexpected changes and that emergencies take place, so we require a written two week notice for any student who withdraws before the end of the school year. Your tuition will be prorated once your written notice has been received by the school office.

Health Rules

1. It is imperative that parents respond to phone calls immediately concerning a child that has been identified as ill by the school. Immediate parental attention is required in the case of illness accompanied by high temperature or physical injury.
 - a. Students who are ill must be picked up immediately. In addition to their own discomfort, they can expose other students and adults.
 - b. Students that have a fever of 100 degrees or higher or show signs of significant illness must be taken home immediately. They can return to school when fever has been gone for 24 hours, without the help of medication.
2. School personnel may not administer non-prescription medication. Children are not to be sent to school if they are not well enough to go to the playground or participate in class.
3. All prescription medicine must be checked into the school office and recorded in the medicine book. It is imperative that you notify the office staff when you sign in medicine. The medicine will be stored in the refrigerator in the kitchen or a secured cabinet in the office.
4. Communicable diseases such as COVID-19, Strep Throat, Chicken Pox, Measles, Scarlet Fever, etc. must be reported to the school office so that an exposure notice can be communicated and/or posted depending on the disease. The child must also pass the contagious stage given by the doctor before the student may return to school. If the school detects the student may not be ready to return, the parent must get a re-admittance slip from the doctor. The school assumes the parent will use wisdom and discretion when their child has experienced a communicable disease.
5. If a student's household member has COVID-19 it must be reported to the school office so that next steps may be taken.
6. A child who vomits from an upset stomach must be picked up immediately and stay home until the vomiting has stopped for at least 24 hours.
7. A child with diarrhea (3 or more watery stools in 24 hours) should stay home until the diarrhea has stopped for at least 24 hours.
8. Parents please use extra-careful judgment when sending your child back to school after an illness. We are carefully cleaning all areas, and encouraging children to wash their hands multiple times throughout the day.
9. In the event of lice outbreak:
 - a. Child must be picked up immediately.
 - b. Office must check the student's hair before returning to class.

- c. Child may not return to class until all the eggs and nits are out of hair.

Late Pick Up

Students must be picked up at the designated time. Any student not picked up at dismissal (2:30 PM/3:00 PM) will be sent to the extended care program for \$40 that day. A late charge of \$1.00 per minute will be assessed up until 6:00 PM. After 6:00 PM a \$5.00 per minute fee will be assessed. It must be paid in full with your tuition payment. If a parent is more than one hour late, we may call Child Protective Services.

Absences

Regular school attendance is required by law and is necessary for good citizenship. Punctuality is a very important life skill that we want every student to develop. It is important for the start of the class and each child. Late students are disruptive to the whole class.

Excused Absences

Excused absences will be issued to students who miss the majority of the school day for reasons deemed excusable. An absence will be excused if it is for one of the following reasons:

1. Illness or injury.
2. Medical appointment. Whenever possible, please schedule medical and dental appointments after school hours. If this is not possible, or if multiple appointments must be scheduled, please vary their scheduled times.
3. Bereavement
4. Court appearances
5. Family emergencies (ex: car accident, major family illness)

Unexcused Absences

Unexcused absences will be issued to students who miss the majority of the school day for any reason that does not qualify as an excused absence.

Excessive Tardies/Absences

California State Attendance laws allow 3 tardies and 3 unexcused absences per year. SCS adheres to the laws of the state regarding Compulsory Education, Tardies, and Absences. Excessive unexcused absences (20 or more) may require retention in the same grade level, as consistent tardiness or absence directly affects a student's academic progress.

Prearranged Absences

Prearranged absences must be approved for students through the administration and the teacher in advance of the absences (ex: A student leaving the country for an extended period of time). Make-up work will not be given ahead of time unless the absence is due to prolonged illness, surgery, etc. Students will receive their makeup work upon return. Parents need to realize that such an absence will affect their students progress in school and their workload upon return.

Tardy Policy

Being on time at the start of every school day is essential for maintaining an effective learning environment for each child in the class.

Parent/Teacher Communication

This is an area that we as a school community highly value and want to ensure is happening frequently and satisfactorily; we ask that you partner with us. If we have a concern about your child in terms of his/her academics, behavior, or other area of development we will be contacting you to set up a parent-teacher conference. If necessary, the Principal will be available to assist. We ask that you make yourself available so that we can partner together for the benefit of your child.

If you have a concern about your child, your child's teacher, or a situation in which your child was involved, please take the appropriate first step of talking with your child's teacher in a professional manner. If you still have concerns after discussing with your child's teacher please bring this to the attention of the school office. We appreciate you letting us know about your concerns and will seek a solution as quickly as possible. It is our heart to have open lines of communication. Please do not hesitate to talk with us about what is on your heart.

Homework

Homework philosophy at Sunnyvale Christian School is that we strive to teach students to take responsibility for work that has been assigned to them, specifically work they have not completed during the allotted time in the class during the school day. Homework is best completed with oversight of parents, to be considered quality time that allows the parents to assess their child's current progress, encourage the student's heart and to affirm their diligence. Please provide a quiet, calm place for homework. Please commit to working together. Students are expected to turn in all homework assignments on time as required by the teachers and be reading with their families each night. If missing assignments become a problem, parents will be notified. Each teacher will develop a policy on late homework teaching students to take responsibility for their own work.

Student's Personal Property

All clothing and school items (lunch box, backpack, etc.) must be clearly labeled with the student's name, using either permanent ink or clothing labels. The school is not responsible for items left on the school premises. The campus is used by the church on weekends and weeknights, so it is each student's responsibility to collect their things.

1. No personal toys, games, or electronic devices are allowed on campus. The only exception would be if the teacher has a class function, activity, or reward system that allows students to bring such items.
2. No cell phones. Students are not allowed to have cell phones during school hours. If a parent wants their child to have a cell phone, it must be signed into the office and kept at the front desk. The student may be granted permission by the teacher to go to the office to call parents when the teacher deems it acceptable.

3. No weapons of any sort are allowed on the campus.
4. The school is not responsible for student's personal items and students are not to bring valuable items to school.
5. Each student's locker must be kept clean. Decorating lockers is not allowed. No stickers and no locks may be used. Personal items may not be stored for prolonged periods of time. Every Friday the student lockers must be clean and empty, as this campus is used extensively by Crosswalk Community Church as well as other faith communities throughout the week.

Student's Dress Code

Sunnyvale Christian School requires that uniforms be worn by all students from Transitional Kindergarten through Fifth Grade. Parents may purchase parts of the uniform at stores other than Merry Mart or Uniforms by Tommy Hilfiger; however, they must match the uniforms at Merry Mart or Uniforms by Tommy Hilfiger.

Current student dress code is on our website. Every family is responsible for having their students in proper uniform Monday-Thursday. Friday is free dress day.

Uniform Policy Enforcement

Professionalism is modeled by the staff effectively teaching children to take healthy pride in their personal appearance as an individual and as a representative of the school. If there is a dress code violation, the parent/guardian will be immediately contacted to correct the infraction. The classroom teacher is primarily responsible to work with the parents to ensure compliance.

Emergency Drills & Procedures

While we have done a great deal at SCS to make the facilities and grounds safe, and to prepare the students and staff to respond effectively in emergencies, the families of our students must be our partners in this effort. We want to briefly summarize some of the important emergency drills and procedures. If you would like to read through our Emergency Procedures Handbook please make your request to the office so we can get a copy for you.

Every student must have a complete file with Consent for Medical Treatment, known allergies, and an emergency form. This is to assure proper medical care of each student should an emergency arise. Promptly report any updates to your child's information.

In case of a medical emergency, the witness to the accident will call the office and/or any other trained staff member (First Aid/CPR) to assess the situation. The nearest available staff member will call 911 if deemed necessary. The student's parent's will be notified of the accident.

Below we have listed a summary of procedures we follow during emergencies. In all cases, the priority is the safety of the children and staff. In setting effective protocol, we ask that you also do the same in your household for your own family's safety.

In the case of a Bay Area earthquake or natural disaster, students will be kept at school until a parent or authorized adult picks them up. It is imperative that the authorized person speaks with the teacher or designated staff member supervising your child(ren) so we maintain accurate accounting of all children. Please plan how your family will respond to major disasters, assuming the telephone lines may be down and public transportation may be in disarray. Please refer to our Emergency Procedures Handbook, available in the office. We trust you will also practice earthquake and fire drills at your home as we partner together for the safety of our children.

1. Fire drills are conducted monthly. Students and staff walk quickly and quietly out of the building, one class at a time, following posted exit routes in the back of the parking lot for accountability.
2. Earthquake drills are conducted bi-monthly:
 - a. Stay calm
 - b. If indoors, stay indoors. Stay put, drop, cover, and hold for one minute or until shaking stops.
 - c. If you are outdoors, stay outdoors. Move to an open area away from power lines or poles.
 - d. Move away from windows or other large hazardous objects.
 - e. Squat down, tuck head under, and place hands and arms over head and neck to prevent injury.
 - f. Calmly move away from the building to the back of the parking lot. Be prepared for aftershocks.
3. Evacuation drills are conducted at least once a year, without leaving the campus.
4. Each teacher has an emergency pack by the door which includes an emergency roster of parent contact information. Please keep your teacher and the office informed of any changes to your personal contact information.
5. Evacuation Procedures: After following the procedures for a fire drill and 911 has been called, the students will be initially moved off campus to either the grass area located in the shopping center at Washington Ave. and Mary Ave at 245 S. Mary Ave. Sunnyvale, CA 94086. The grass area near the main office located in the Olive Garden Apartments behind the school at 1081 W. Olive Ave. Sunnyvale, CA 94086. As soon as possible, we will contact parents to notify them of the situation.
6. We will contact parents regarding emergencies, specifically for an injured child. We want to inform parents as quickly as possible, but please realize that the first and foremost priority is the safety of the children.
7. In an emergency, our alternative meeting place is either the grass area located in the shopping center at Washington Ave. and Mary Ave at 245 S. Mary Ave. Sunnyvale, CA 94086. The grass area near the main office located in the Olive Garden Apartments behind the school at 1081 W. Olive Ave. Sunnyvale, CA 94086.
8. For more information on our emergency procedures, please refer to the Emergency Procedures Handbook in the school office.

Willful, Careless or Accidental Damage to Property

The parent or guardian of any student whose willful misconduct, carelessness, or accident causes damage to school property will be responsible for those damages.

Student Conduct

Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that is honoring to God, themselves, their parents, and the school. As students of a Christian school, we believe that the children should be taught about God, and how to honor God through their words and deeds. We teach the children a high standard of conduct and then give them the appropriate encouragement and example to behave accordingly. As a Christian school, we want every child to experience the love of God through Jesus Christ so that they can share that love with their family, community, and world. These expectations of the students apply to the time that students are in school, at school activities, and the time they are away from school. We believe we are to embody Christ in all that we say and do, so that God may be glorified. We expect respectful behavior at all times!

School Rules

Inside Rules

1. Use quiet inside voices.
2. Raise your hand if you wish to speak.
3. Walk at all times.
4. Push the chair in when leaving a desk/table.
5. Keep hands and feet to yourself.
6. Listen to the teacher.
7. One person talking at a time.
8. Keep your classroom clean.
9. Respect each other.
10. Must be excused by the teacher before leaving with the parent.

Lunch Rules (all of the above and these):

1. Sit properly at the lunch tables (on bottom, facing forward).
2. Keep your area clean. If you spill, immediately notify a teacher. It is the student's responsibility to leave their personal space clean.
3. Must be excused to use the restroom.

Outside Rules (all of the above and these):

1. Treat others as you would like to be treated.
2. Play peacefully with one another. No games that lead to physical contact or aggression in word or deed.
3. No use of toys or equipment while on the playground structures.
4. Rocks and tan bark must stay on the ground and are not to be thrown.
5. Use playground equipment and structures safely.
6. Stay in view of playground teachers at all times.
7. Stay within the fenced-in area, remaining on school premises.

8. Sit on a bench or a picnic table when eating.
9. Do not share food.
10. Swing straight and stay on your seat. Sit on your bottom while swinging.
11. No jumping from the swings.
12. No balls/play equipment under the swings.
13. Jump ropes are for jumping only.
14. Tires are to be stacked no taller than 2 tires high.
15. Only go down the slides, not up.
16. Slide sitting down and feet first.
17. Only two students in the restrooms at one time.
18. Restrooms are to be used properly.
19. No standing on top of bars.
20. Sitting on top of high monkey bars is only for second grade and above.
21. Use balls safely and appropriately (do not put others in harm's way, or the game will be stopped).
22. No throwing balls against walls.
23. Report all balls that go over the fence or on the roof to a teacher.
24. Keep balls on the blacktop and not on playground equipment.
25. Show respect to your teachers.

Student Discipline

We strongly believe in discipline, love, and guidance.

We believe that as followers of Christ:

- a. We should not ignore any situation requiring discipline.
- b. We should communicate that Jesus loves each child, regardless of what they do, and that learning to make right choices is best taught through consequential discipline for making wrong choices.
- c. We should be respectful, consistent, and honest to hold children responsible for their behavior. God emphasizes in the scriptures, "I am the Lord your God, who teaches you what is best for you, who directs you in the way you should go" (Isaiah 48:17).

SCS discipline policy:

Disciplinary action is carried out as needed to uphold the standards of conduct and to enforce school policy. Discipline is administered carefully and attempts to keep in balance the interest of the child with that of the Elementary as a whole. We strive to work in partnership with the parents.

1. The teacher talks to the child (verbal warning) redirecting the child, if necessary.
2. Individual classroom behavioral management steps will be enforced.
3. A disciplinary note will be sent home from the primary teacher to the parents, which will be signed by the teacher explaining the infraction, and will require the parent's and student's signatures. It must be returned the following day by the student. A copy of this letter will be sent to the Principal the day it is sent home.
4. The misbehavior will automatically result in the child being sent to the Principal's office and the parents will receive a phone call to come and pick up their child. In addition, a

parent-teacher conference will include, at a minimum, the primary teacher, parent, and the Principal. The objective is to successfully partner together for the betterment of the student and the modification of misbehavior. We will consider the student's holistic development and behavior in the classroom, in other classes, as well as in the lunchroom, and recess. We will develop a plan to build character and confidence in the student and modify the behavior that has been inappropriate.

In more severe challenges, we may recommend professional counseling. SCS is not equipped to deal with constant emotional disturbances or significant learning disabilities since we do not provide a special education teacher. SCS will not tolerate profanity or obscenity by work or action, disrespect to any personnel of the school or towards parents, or acts of aggression or violence toward any person. SCS has a zero tolerance policy regarding the possession, use, sharing, or sale of illegal drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or weapons of any kind on school grounds. Harassment of any kind will not be tolerated. Appropriate and swift discipline will be administered. This includes bullying, acting in ways that scare or harm another person. Suspensions are determined by the administration and only after discussion with the teacher and conducting a thorough review of the incident at hand. This review will include an interview with each party involved, any adult witnesses, (including the child's teacher) to garner surrounding information. Following a suspension, when the student returns, he/she begins with a new slate. The mistakes of yesterday are forgiven and we begin anew. However, should the misbehavior continue, a meeting will be required to discuss specific, necessary steps to avoid expulsion.
